I'm responsible for many functions in AR including taking customer calls, updating payment statuses, and qualifying patient refunds.

After several moves, we finally settled in Kansas where we purchased a homestead where we raise our son and care for all kinds of farm animals. My son and I milk goats daily and I use the goat milk in my homemade soaps. We also share our home with numerous reptile species and two American Bully XL dogs.

We feel so blessed to be 9 years sober. I am proof that you can go from living on the streets to being a productive citizen and homeowner in recovery. Recovery is possible.

What was your first job?

Wart Hog BBQ pit in Puyallup WA. Half of the building is a meat smoker so I always smelled good after leaving work.

Who is someone you really admire?

My grandpa, he raised 8 kids all by himself. I was his only granddaughter and I have two cousins. We grew up together around his house. Even through my addiction my grandpa was always there and never judged me. I am very thankful that I was sober and he was still here when my son was born on his birthday. He has passed but I am so blessed to have a precious angel in him.

Who would play you in a movie about your life?

I had to ask my co-workers for advice on this one. Drew Barrymore because I'm quirky, bubbly and today my hair looks a lot like hers. Lol!

What would we most likely find you doing on the weekend?

- Saturdays sewing, baking and outside chores.
- Saturday evenings goat therapy for Sunday wrestling tournaments.
- Sunday wrestling tournaments, I'm not too quiet when my heart is out on that mat. This explains why I need goat therapy the night before.

Who has influenced you most when it comes to how you approach your work?

My supervisor Kerri R. She is kind and respectful in instructing and constructive criticism. She is patient and understanding. She has allowed me the time to learn and become independent in my duties. Kerri and my coworkers have help me gain confidence in my work.

Is there something that has made you smile recently?

Yes, actually this morning. My son's goat Stellar she has a personality that is very friendly and nosey. She attempted to get in my vehicle to come to work by jumping into my lap and nibble on my hair. When I told her no and got her out and off of me, I shut the door she gave it a little head butt and her mad BAAHH!

What led you to this career?

What staff member most influenced your treatment stay?

My counselor Lana! She is the best and I love her for everything she did for me during my time there.

What is life like today in recovery?

I absolutely love my life in recovery! No drugs and no alcohol! I left Valley Hope and hit a meeting that same night and have been going to my home group there since.

What piece of advice would you share with others seeking recovery?

You have to want it! I mean with every fiber of your being and you have to do it for yourself and not because you were told to just to appease anyone else in your life.

"People need to know there is hope out there. They are not alone. It can and will get better..."

What was your biggest takeaway as a patient at Valley Hope that has informed your recovery journey? I'm not a horrible person, and I'm not alone. I was at PVH in October of 2017 too. Back then, I still had it in my mind that this was my choice and it was my fault. After some of the classes that explained what alcohol does to our body and mind, I had a much better idea of what this illness is all about. I didn't choose this. I am a good person who has an illness that is treatable daily.

What staff member most influenced your treatment stay? I can't choose just one. Tammy was my counselor, and she just has the sweetest, most precious soul. I could tell she actually cared about me as a person. Dale was my chaplain. After suffering from religious trauma as a child, one of my biggest fears was being forced into what I saw as "the religious part of it." The kitch en staff - absolutely stellar!

What is life like today in recovery? I finally love me! My first attempt at sobriety in 2017 was for other people. This time, my recovery is for myself. I have finally forgiven myself for the choices I made during my body and mind reacting to trauma. No longer am I comparing myself to others. My dreams really are coming true. I am accomplishing things in my life that I truly only thought were dreams. I have a calmness and acceptance in my soul for this life that I never thought possible. I wish I could share this feeling with everyone.

FOUNDATION UPDATE

THE 56TH ANNUAL GIFT OF RECOVERY DRIVE IS UNDERWAY!

This historic drive generates the necessary funds to assist patients in the coming year. Early Valley

Hope leadership quickly recognized that many patients, due to the consequence of their addiction, lacked financial resources for the cost of treatment and immediate needs. The end of the year drive was created to provide this support. The tradition continues after 56 years! Last year 2,437 patients were helped by donated funds.

All donations to this drive are matched through January 31, 2024, dollar for dollar, thanks to donors who created a matching pool of \$200,000. Our drive goal this year is \$400,000.
